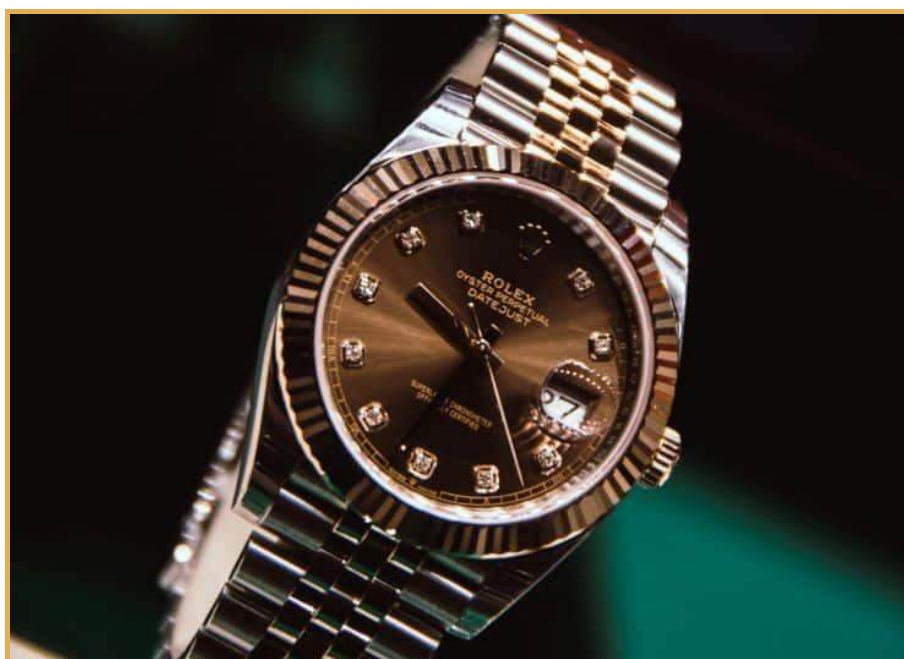


Key Differences Between Grand Seiko and Rolex
