Versace's evolution brought cleaner dials, better proportions, improved finishing, and more serious movement sourcing. The Medusa remained, the Greca became structural, and newer collections attracted buyers evaluating the full watch on its actual merits.



4. Who Collects Versace Watches Today

The contemporary Versace collector rotates Swiss heritage pieces alongside Versace pieces, valuing each differently. Italian fashion heritage expressed on a dial, something a Patek or IWC doesn't offer, carries genuine value for design-minded collectors today.

5. Keeping a Versace Collection-Ready

Versace watches require professional service that respects bold dials and distinctive finishes. Gasket replacement and pressure testing after any case-opening service restore the water resistance the rating promises, a visual caseback inspection does not.



6. Where Versace Stands in the Watch World Now

Versace is further along the path from fashion to watch brand than most observers expected. Consistent improvement and a serious collector base have earned it credibility that the skepticism surrounding its early entry suggested might never actually arrive.

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
